Dear Parents and Campers,

Hashem again informs Moshe Rabbeinu in Parshas Pinchas that he will not be going into Eretz Yisroel. At this point, Moshe davens that Hashem should appoint the right successor, someone who has the quality of:

"אשר יצא לפניהם ואשר יבא לפניהם" "[one] who will go out before them, and who will come in before them."

Hashem then instructs Moshe to pick Yehoshua as our next leader.

What is meant by this particular quality? Rashi explains there is a stark contrast between monarchs of the world and Jewish leaders. While the royalty of other nations sit on their thrones and send out others to risk their lives for their country, not so by B'nei Yisroel. Our leaders are on the front lines. As Rashi mentions, Moshe himself did battle with Sichon and Og. Yehoshua also led the troops into battle. And, famously, this was Dovid Hamelech's legacy; a fierce warrior determined to protect our nation, despite great personal risk to himself.

Two weeks in, I have had the Zechus to interact with our "leaders" at Eeshay, and I could emphatically state they have this same quality. I would like to be Makir Tov to our tremendous counselors, Yaakov and Efraim Glatt, for going above and beyond for our campers. There is no "sitting on their throne while others do their bidding" mentality whatsoever! They are on the front lines day in and day out, making sure our campers are having an amazing experience at Eeshay. Yasher Koach Rabbosai, your dedication is truly inspiring!
