

This week's Parsha starts off with Moshe Rabbeinu speaking to Bnei Yiroel at a very specific location in the Midbar. There are a number of different cities the Torah uses to identify this spot. Rashi points out that these were not real places, rather each "city" was alluding to the various mistakes we made on our travels ("קום "סוף is a reference to our lack of Bitachon by the יחבר", "בר" refers to the מנל הזהב ("Rashi concludes that the Torah is vague when discussing our mistakes, "מפני כבודן של ישראל", to protect our honor.

One might be inclined to think that in Moshe's final speech to our people before his passing, he would deliver the big blow. Leave no stone unturned to ensure we understood with crystal clarity what we had done wrong, so we could take the necessary steps to improve our behavior. But Moshe takes the opposite approach! Instead of overtly mentioning our missteps, he merely hints to them, so our dignity could remain intact. Moshe understood that more important than heavy handed Mussar was encouragement; if we believed we were great, we would hold ourselves up to that standard.

I believe this is a hallmark here at Eeshay. Our staff is incredible, always encouraging, constantly reminding our campers how great they are. We are complimenting and correcting, not criticizing. Our campers are absolute gems; when they are spoken to as such, the results speak for themselves!
