

DEAR PARENTS & CAMPERS,

As we are obviously on the verge of the historical and difficult day of Tisha B'Av, I had a thought that I would like to share. Our learning group in camp is learning Makkos, and we came across a very interesting line recently. The Posuk says by Eidim Zommemin, a certain kind of false witness, the following words. "עַל פִּי שְׁנַיִם עֵדִים אִוְּ", שְׁלֹשָׁה עֵדִים יוֹמֵת הַמֵּת, on the mouth of two witnesses, or three, we should execute." The question is clear. If two witnesses, thoroughly corroborated, provide sufficient evidence to carry out such a significant penalty, is it not obvious that three could do the same thing? Why even mention three at all?

Says Rebbe Akiva in the final answer, we are talking about false witnesses, who themselves get punished for trying to harm someone unlawfully. So by two witnesses, of course they would both get punished, as they are both integral to the testimony. But by the third one, one might think he should be off the hook, as he was an add-on, the "third wheel," so to speak. Could he not make the argument "why penalize me at all? I was immaterial to the case!" So the Torah tells us no, just like by two, also by three. Even the insignificant party gets penalized for doing the wrong thing.

But then the Mishna concludes with some interesting words. It says if this is the penalty to an "add-on" by an Aveira, imagine the reward to an "add-on" by a Mitzvah! We know Hashem rewards five hundred times more powerful than He punishes. This Posuk tells us it is not just the headliners who receive all the accolades. Every person who plays a role in something good, no matter how minor it is, the reward in Shomayim is beyond our comprehension!

We know the second Beis Hamikdash was destroyed because of Sinas Chinam, baseless hatred. We sometimes get fixated on the Chessed champions, the movers and shakers, and assume surely they are the antidote who will pave the way for Moshiach. But Hashem notices and cherishes every single act of goodwill between his children! Looking around camp, this is what we see on a daily basis. Honest genuine friendship. Laughing together, competing together, supporting together, sharing good times together. All of it is significant, and no doubt we are doing our part to BeEzras Hashem bring the final Geulah! Keep It up, Eeshay!
